



## **Environmental Field Technician wanted for Field Season 2023!**

**Position Title:** Environmental Technician.

**Salary:** \$14 per hour.

**Employment Status:** Part time, seasonal 30 to 40 hours a week.

**Position:** The Passamaquoddy Sipayik Environmental Department is looking for a motivated individual that can work part time (30-40 Hours per week) for the 2023 field season. The Environmental Technician (ET) will be under the immediate supervision of the Environmental Ecology Manager. Also, the ET will work cooperatively with other Tribal programs, work with summer youth, and the summer college employment program.

**Role:** The Environmental Technician will be expected to primarily work with the Ecology Program. The Ecology Program Manager will train and mentor the Environmental Technician for the duration of the 2023 field season employment, with the goals to rehire this individual next field season, where the Environmental Technician can independently work on similar projects the Ecology Program will have during the field season. When necessary, the ET shall assist the environmental department in performing some of the grant related projects. Staff members will also work with the ET in air and water quality monitoring efforts, GIS/GPS data collecting and mapping, fisheries monitoring, and perform site visits to tribal trust and fee lands.

**Duties:**

- Work on projects and programs funded by USEPA, BIA, USFWS, DOE, USDA and other federal & non-federal sources.
- Technician will be responsible for using lab and field equipment.

- Assist in fish passage assessments and site surveys using drones.
- Assess eel passage at dam sites.
- Assist in the installation of monitoring systems (cameras) at fish-ways.
- Assist in building baffles for fishways.
- Beaver dam evaluation.
- Data collection and entry and perform repairs on field equipment as needed.
- Be ready rain or shine.
- Will be trained in the use of multiple watercrafts.
- Training provided for the use of environmental monitoring equipment, GPS/GIS.
- Will be required to be on watercrafts on rivers, lakes, and ocean waters with a minimum of one environmental department staff member.

**Qualifications:**

- College student preferred, but not required.
- Proof of current admission in College.
- Work as a team player.
- Maintain professionalism at all times.
- Able to carry and lift moderate to heavy field equipment to monitoring sites.
- Able to cross the Canadian border.
- Willing to accommodate a flexible work schedule.

Preference will be given to a qualified Native American.
